

Position Announcement: Bilingual Educator (Spanish)

Employment Type: Full time, 30-40 hrs/week

Compensation: Starting at \$15-16/hour plus benefits including health insurance and holiday, vacation, and sick time

About the Position

The Bilingual Educator will work as an integral part of the Corvallis Environmental Center team and be responsible for daily implementation of Farm to School and Nature Education classes and activities. This includes Classroom Food Adventures, school garden education, field trips, day camps, summer camps, and preschool programs. This position will focus primarily on farm to school education in Spring and Fall and day camps in Summer, with the possibility of expanding into other areas depending on program needs. Work takes place in school classrooms and gardens, parks and natural areas, Avery House Nature Center, Starker Arts Garden for Education, and office settings.

About the Corvallis Environmental Center

The Corvallis Environmental Center (CEC) envisions a community in which People Learn, People Care, People Act. In pursuit of this vision, our mission is to educate, engage, and inspire people to create a healthy, sustainable community. We do this through local & healthy food initiatives, nature-based education, and community events. Job Responsibilities

- Prepare and lead educational programs including day camps, school programs, field trips, family programming, and more, primarily for ages 3-14
- Collaborate with local schools and community partners to implement programming and events
- Work with other program staff to develop and implement new education programs
- Coordinate and oversee volunteers and interns
- Develop and administer program evaluations
- Participate in staff meetings and organization events
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications

- Fluency in Spanish (required)
- Bachelor's degree or equivalent work experience in youth education, community food systems, public health, environmental/food policy, nutrition, or related field
- Experience teaching food, nature, and/or garden education in both outdoor and classroom settings
- Self-motivated, hardworking, professional, and dependable
- Ability to work independently, in a team, and in a support role
- Well-organized and detail-oriented
- Excellent written and oral communication skills
